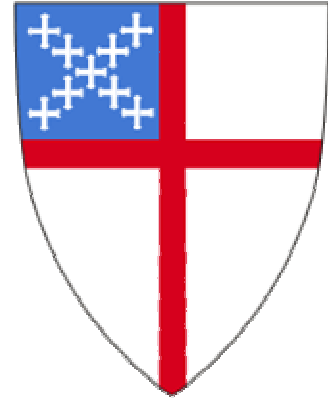

***Safe Church at Saint Paul's***

On November 18, 2006 Saint Paul's hosted a session of *Safe Church* training for the Diocese of Massachusetts. There were 2 trainers and 31 attendees present for the day-long training. Our coordinator was Sue Ramsley, and hospitality was provided by Gretchen Carr, Ruth Warner and Phil Robidoux (Mr. Coffee!).

The diocesan coordinator for *Safe Church* has called and thanked the parish for both the smooth way things ran and for our "outstanding hospitality."

Eleven of the attendees were from Saint Paul's—six were members of the vestry. The day was fairly long, and the material covered was fairly disturbing. The world most of us grew up in is gone, and the world our children are growing up in is much more dangerous. The training sessions focused on helping us to be aware of the dangers, making us aware of our legal responsibilities, and on providing strategies and structure for keeping our children safe.

One of the most helpful times for me was a frank moment when one of the presenters, who herself comes from a small parish, talked about building a *Safe Church Culture*, at her church--while they are working hard toward fulfilling all the requirements of a *Safe Church*

### **Sunday Worship**

The Sunday worship schedule is centered on the Holy Eucharist, Rite II at 10AM. This service is celebrated for the first three Sundays of the month. *Program as they were able.*

Some of the things we will have to do as we start our program are going to feel strange. We must have all those who will be working with children fill out applications and submit to background checks. We must have two adults with any group of children that are participating in any church program or event. We must institutionalize our *Safe Church* practices with our own manual of policies and procedures, and document our compliance with those procedures. All this may seem overwhelming, and come of it may seem unnecessary--especially applications and background checks on people that are well known and well loved.

Years ago I read the Hornblower books. In one of them Captain Hornblower was about to inspect the ship. His long time friend and subordinate, Lt. Bush, was the First Lieutenant, responsible for all that happened "above decks." Hornblower knew that Lt. Bush was completely competent and faithful in the execution of his office. It was out of long standing affection and respect that Hornblower's inspection of "above decks" was particularly rigorous. Out of long standing affection and respect, we must ask our existing volunteers to submit to the same requirements as new volunteers.

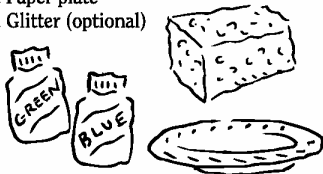
## Just for kid

### "Peace on Earth" Ornament

Make this Earth ornament as a reminder to pray for the peace Jesus will bring when he returns.

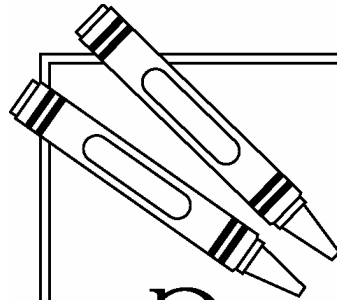
*What you will need:*

1. Clear glass ornament
2. Blue and green acrylic craft paint
3. Sponge
4. Scissors
5. Black permanent marker (Sharpie) or black puffy craft paint
6. Paper plate
7. Glitter (optional)



*What you need to do:*

1. Cut the sponge into 2 rectangles, about the size of your tallest finger.
2. Pour a little paint onto a plate. (Add glitter if you want your ornament to sparkle.)
3. Use one sponge for blue and one for green.
4. Dab the paint onto your glass ornament one color at a time. Use green for land and blue for ocean to make the ornament look like our planet Earth.
5. When the paint is dry, use the marker or puffy paint to write PEACE on the ornament.
6. Use your ornament as a Christmas decoration or give it as a present.
